We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for Schall Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2021-22. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

The data in our Annual Education Report shows an increase in proficiency in all grades, subgroups and content areas except 3rd grade ELA as compared to the data from the previous year. Across all grades and content area we performed slightly below the state. We are making changes in our programming and instructional tools and utilizing data to help us make decisions to close the achievement gaps. Despite the challenges that COVID has created we have made great strides in improving our programming and instruction.


Schall Elementary School is a 3rd through 5th grade building which provides the instruction for all 3rd through 5th grade students in the district.


Our school improvement plan is a continual work in progress. We meet to review our school improvement plan several times a year. We develop new plans based on our school's evaluation data to be consistent across the district. We have implemented our strategies and are evaluating their success in achieving our goals and objectives. We have a goal for social and emotional learning. We are working to meet the social and emotional as well as the academic needs of all of our students. Since we no longer have building school improvement plans but only district plans through the state, Schall Elementary is creating detailed written plans for all subjects. Our plans are in line with the objectives and strategies in the district plan.

A copy of our core curriculum can be obtained by contacting your child's teacher or the school office. Schall Elementary follows the Common Core standards as they have been adopted by the state. Our curriculum is continually updated as we find new strategies and resources to better meet our student needs.

During the 2021-2022 school year, our students were tested through the online NWEA testing program in Reading and Mathematics in the fall, winter, and spring. We meet to review how students perform on assessments and use that information to plan learning and interventions. Here is a chart that summarizes student growth from fall to spring over a period of years.

All of our NWEA data showed good growth for the 21-22 school year. However, we know that we have lots of work to do to get our student where they need to be and are utilizing accelerated learning, new programs, focused instruction, formative assessment and a variety of other strategies to help our students grow.

We are actively working to address any achievement gaps by:

- Including subgroup students in intervention services on a daily basis.
- Improving instruction through participation in Excellence in Education for math.
- Improving instruction through curriculum alignment in all core subject areas.
- Improving instruction through teacher professional development in ELA, Math, Science. SEL and Technology.
- Integrating research based instructional strategies in all classrooms to improve student engagement and achievement.
- Implementing the Literacy Essentials in all classrooms every day.
- Providing individualized and small group math and reading instruction through guided math and reading groups.

- Providing professional development and instructional expectations for all teachers in the use formative assessment and student engagement.
- Providing whole school intervention time.
- Utilizing Title I and in class intervention support for students who are at risk.
- Providing Corrective Reading for Tier 3 reading students.
- Providing instruction in Social and Emotional Learning through Capturing Kids' Hearts Implementation.
- Following our written literacy plan to ensure strong and consistent literacy instruction for all students.
- Utilizing Lexia and eSpark for individualized reading support for each student.
- Utilizing eSpark and Reflex for math skill support for all students.
- Implementing Eureka Math Squared as our core math program.
- Implementing Into Reading as our core ela program
- Participating in the SRSD writing research program.
- Participating in the FAME (Formative Assessment for Michigan Educators) coaching.
- Utilizing a literacy and math coach to improve instructional practices.

At Parent Teacher Conferences in October of 2022, 97% (285) of our students had parent representatives in attendance.

As a Community of Learners, we will do our best to provide a variety of educational experiences for your child to help him/her develop to the best of their potential as well as grow to embrace lifelong learning. We strive to cultivate excellence in all of our students. The staff of Schall Elementary School are working hard to improve and make significant changes to meet and exceed State and National Standards.
